Powerful and poignant, FOSTER is a compassionate and eye-opening look at the foster care system as seen through the eyes of those who know it best.

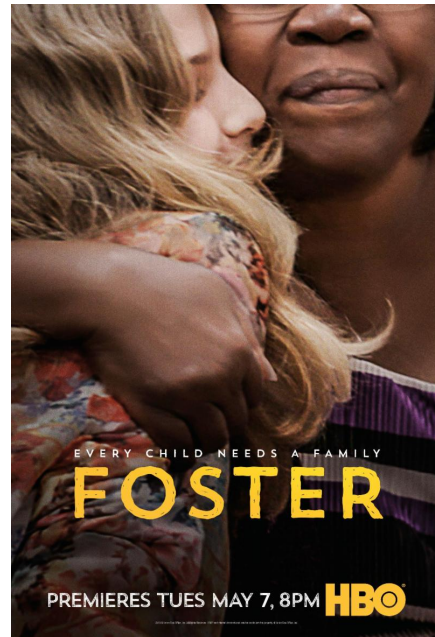
